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Chapter 1 General Rule

1. Introduction

Pursuant to the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (hereinafter referred to as the "Dodd-Frank Act") which requires publically traded companies to provide disclosure regarding their use of gold, tin, tungsten and tantalum (known as Conflict Minerals, hereinafter referred to as "Conflict Minerals") originated in the Democratic Republic of Congo and its neighboring countries (hereinafter referred to as the "DRC region") with an aim to cut off the financial resources to the armed groups in the DRC region, JCM Group has created the following policy and the guideline. In accordance with this policy and the guideline, JCM would like its suppliers to investigate whether or not the materials or the parts used for its products contain Conflict Minerals and to report to us.

2. JCM Group's Policy for Conflict Minerals

• Non use of Conflict Minerals

"Because of the concern that the use of minerals originated in the DRC region where conflicts are ongoing helps support the inhumane acts committed in the region," the Dodd-Frank Act was passed in the U.S in July, 2010, which directs the Securities and Exchange Commission to issue rules requiring publically traded companies in the U.S. to disclose whether or not their products contain Conflict Minerals.

JCM is not a publically traded company in the U.S, but to respect for the purpose of this law and to fulfill its role in the supply chain, JCM shall promote non use of Conflict Minerals. JCM shall be requesting its suppliers to investigate where the minerals used in their products come from. And if it turns out that their products contain Conflict Minerals, JCM shall request the suppliers to use "Conflict Free" minerals and if no improvement is seen, JCM shall cease to do business with them.

3. Conflict Minerals Guideline

3.1 Objective

The objective of this guideline is to clarify the rule of procurement to all JCM Group's suppliers in order to achieve Conflict Free policy and to promote non use of the products containing Conflict Minerals.

JCM Group shall comply with the law relating to Conflict Minerals and require its suppliers to report whether the minerals contained in the materials, parts, units used for their products are Conflict Minerals. JCM's objective is to eliminate Conflict Minerals from its supply chain.

3.2 Scope

This guideline shall apply to the rule requiring the disclosure of the use of Conflict Minerals regulated by the Dodd-Frank Act.

 Scope of application to products This guideline shall apply to all the JCM brand products sold to publically traded companies in the U.S.
