## JCM RECEIVES PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION AGAINST MEI

## Action is the Second Consecutive Court Ruling in JCM's Favor

LAS VEGAS (August 30, 2005) – JCM American Corp. has successfully secured a preliminary injunction in its suit against Mars Electronics International (MEI) and MEI executive Thomas Nugent. Late last week, the Federal Courts confirmed the temporary restraining order issued last month. This injunction prevents MEI and Nugent from divulging, using or misappropriating JCM trade secrets and proprietary information and from interfering with the business relationship between JCM and its customers pending a final decision in the action.

The injunction came about as part of a complaint JCM filed against MEI and Nugent alleging breach of an employee confidentiality agreement, misappropriation of trade secrets and interference with business causes of action and other allegations. Nugent was formerly a Vice President of JCM.

JCM Vice President for Gaming Solutions, Tom Nieman said, "We are very pleased with the judge's ruling. JCM will continue to do business as usual and go into the upcoming Global Gaming Expo in Las Vegas confident in the fact that, with this new injunction, we will be able to conduct our business in an environment that is free of misinformation."
